INTRODUCTION

This Tool is all about going deeper in your context. It is designed to help you notice new opportunities and challenges in your context. Designed for individual and group use it is set up to help you soak in and see your community with new eyes.

DIRECTION:

Decide who you want to do this activity and give each person a copy of I-spy or ask them to print a copy out for themselves.

Once everyone has a copy, ask them go on a walk about for 30-60 minutes. Either on their own or in pairs.

Part 1 of this exercise is just about observation, what are you noticing?

Part 2 is meant to be completed by having conversations with at least 3 different people, your encounter on your walkabout.

Part 3 is the debrief. It is designed to set up a robust conversation. After the walkabout, bring together a group and facilitate a conversation to see what was noticed. You can do this online using Zoom or in person.
